

NEW THURSTON ELEMENTARY PROJECT

To support construction of the new Thurston Elementary School, some tree transplanting and limited felling will be necessary and is expected to begin **Monday, March 24, 2025 and be completed before April 1, 2025**. The safety and security of our students, parents, and school community are our first priority and necessary measures are in place to support a safe campus with continued learning. Construction managers and project managers will be coordinating and communicating daily with building administrators. Tree transplanting will be overseen by qualified consultants.

The district recognizes this work will result in a noticeable change to the site as vegetation is removed and trees are transplanted, but AAPS remains committed to environmental sustainability, and is taking efforts to transplant trees where feasible, and salvaging those that otherwise need to be felled.
