To support construction of the new Mitchell Elementary, the following activities will take place on campus, and are referenced on the site plan below. Current Work, Weather Permitting:

- Steel framework is ongoing.
- Masonry continues.
- Cross Laminate Timbers (CLT) installation is ongoing.
- Limited tree removal on the Mitchell/Scarlett campus, for trees previously documented, will begin approximately December 22.

- Students and staff at Mitchell will have an opportunity to sign the final beam and participate in a "Topping Out" ceremony when the final and highest beam is raised into place at the new Mitchell Elementary.



Please note:
